FIRST PITCH

No. 5 Texas Tech (4-1) hosts Northern Illinois (3-0) this weekend for the sixth-annual Brooks Wallace Memorial Series, Feb. 20-21, at Dan Law Field at Rip Griffin Park. This weekend concludes the Red Raiders season-long nine-game homestand to begin the season. The Red Raiders are in the midst of playing 11 games in 14 days (Feb. 17-Mar. 2) while welcoming the Huskies to Lubbock for the fourth time in the last five years. Tech suffered its first loss of the season on Tuesday to Nevada during an 8-4 defeat. The loss snapped a 20-game home win streak for Tech which dated back to last season. The Huskies traveled to Clarksville, Tennessee for opening weekend where they came away with a 3-0 record on a neutral site. NIU claimed victories over South Dakota State (10-6 and 9-6) and Niagara (15-5). The Huskies are under the direction of first-year head coach Mike Kunigonis, who accepted the position in January.

LEADING OFF

- 6th-annual Brooks Wallace Memorial Series honors former Red Raider player/asst. coach Brooks Wallace.
- Wallace, 1-of-4 Red Raiders to have jersey (#22) retired, died at 27 (3/24/85) after bout with leukemia.
- Texas Tech leads Northern Illinois 16-2 in the all-time series which dates back to 2004.
- This year marks the fourth time during the last five seasons that NIU has played Tech in Lubbock.
- Tech is 14-2 against NIU in Lubbock - TTU is 2-0 vs. NIU on a neutral field (San Marcos, Texas - 2008).
- Tech has won 10 straight games over NIU dating back to 2007.
- Eric Gutierrez was named NCBWA Hitter of the Week and Big 12 Player of the Week following Week 1.
- Texas Tech is 41-6 in home non-conference games under third-year head coach Tim Tadlock.
- Tech's 20-game home win streak was snapped vs. Nevada - marked the third longest in school history.
- Tech has 13 players (7 freshmen) that have made their career debuts this season.
- Tech has swept five consecutive home series dating back to last season.



HEAD COACH TIM TADLOCK



Tim Tadlock, the 2014 College Baseball Hall of Fame National Coach of the Year, took the Red Raiders to the College World Series in just his second season while winning the program's first-ever NCAA Regional and Super Regional titles in 2014.

Tadlock and the Red Raiders completed the biggest turnaround in school history and the second biggest turnaround in Big 12 history going from 26 wins in 2013 to 45 wins in 2014.

Tadlock was named head coach of the Texas Tech baseball program on June 8, 2012, becoming the ninth head coach in program history. Tadlock coached his 22nd year in collegiate baseball in 2014.

In two seasons, Tadlock has led the Red Raiders to a 71-51 overall record with a 23-25 record in Big 12 play. The Red Raiders historic 2014 season included winning 45 games (4th most wins in school history), setting 10 school records, defeating 12 nationally-ranked programs – six top-10 teams – receiving 18 consecutive national rankings, which spanned the entire season and sweeping six series (3 Big 12 series) with a No. 8 national ranking in the final poll of the season.

Tadlock was named the ABCA Midwest Region Coach of the Year as well as the Skip Bertman National Coach of the Year while guiding the Red Raiders to their best season in school history with a 45-21 record and 14-10 Big 12 mark. Tech posted just the sixth 40-win regular season in school history while claiming its first-ever NCAA Regional title at the Coral Gables Regional hosted by No. 3 nationally-ranked Miami (Fla.). Tech won the regional with three wins, two of them coming against Miami on its home field.

Tech returned to Lubbock the following week for its first-ever NCAA Super Regional where Red Raider fans sold-out Rip Griffin Park within 40 minutes of tickets going on sale. Tech responded with two thrilling 1-0 shutouts over No. 16 College of Charleston to punch its ticket to Omaha for the first time in school history. On the way, Tech became just the second team in NCAA Super Regional history (since 1999) to post back-to-back shutouts (2002 – LSU) and is the first team to ever win back-to-back 1-0 games in a Super Regional.

The Red Raider pitching staff shined during the postseason in 2014 with a 0.76 ERA in eight games while posting 64 scoreless innings (72 innings played), including 27 consecutive scoreless frames in three straight shutouts and tying an NCAA all-time record with four shutouts in a postseason. Texas Tech joined Cal State Fullerton (2004), Pepperdine (1992), Arizona State (1972), Florida State (1970), St. John's (1968) and Wake Forest (1955) as the only teams in college baseball history to tally four shutouts in a single NCAA postseason. In fact, it was the first time since 1976 that the Red Raiders had posted three straight shutouts at any point of the season.

Also in 2014, Tadlock led Tech to 14 league wins – the program's most since 2004 – while picking up his 500th collegiate career win in a 3-2 victory over West Virginia in Lubbock on May 16, 2014. Tadlock owns a collegiate career record of 506-178 in 11 years as a college head coach with nine seasons at Grayson College (435-127) and two seasons at Tech (71-51).

Tech tied a school record in 2014 with 33 home wins (1993) and set a new school record holding its opponent to two or fewer runs 30 times (25-5 record). Tech also set the following school records in 2014 – shutouts (9), ERA during aluminum bat era (since 1974, 3.11), fielding percentage (.980), ERA in Big 12 games (4.09), games played (66), innings pitched (587.2), putouts (1,763) and assists (809).

Tech was solid in all three phases during 2014. They ranked among the top three in the Big 12 in 12 statistical categories while leading the league in slugging percentage and triples and finishing second in the league in runs, hits, doubles, home runs and RBI.

Outfielder Tyler Neslony became the first Red Raider to lead the Big 12 in batting (.375) while first baseman Eric Gutierrez led the league in home runs (12) and RBI (58), becoming just the second Red Raider to accomplish that feat in the Big 12 era and the first since 2004. Second baseman Bryant Burleson and outfielder/designated hitter Adam Kirsch tied for the Big 12 lead in doubles (21) while Kirsch, the 2014 Big 12 Newcomer of the Year (second time a Red Raider to earn award), led the league in slugging percentage (.560), just ahead of Gutierrez (.539).

Tech finished third in the country in triples (26) and ranked sixth in both double plays turned (65) and fielding percentage (.980). Overall, the Red Raiders ranked among the top-30 in the country in 10 statistical categories.

Tadlock guided the Red Raiders to a 16-game home win streak to end the 2014 season – a new school record for consecutive home wins to complete the season. That streak was also the longest active home win streak in the nation to end the 2014 season.

Tech fans packed Rip Griffin Park all season, including back-to-back sellouts at the NCAA Super Regional with 4,811 in attendance on both days and with 89,355 for the season – a total that ranked 20th in the nation.

Tadlock and his staff have received national honors from each of its first two recruiting classes. Tadlock and staff's first recruiting class (2013 graduates) received a No. 24 ranking by Perfect Game and a No. 27 national ranking by Collegiate Baseball. Tadlock and the Red Raider coaching staff had a 13th ranked recruiting class in 2014 by Collegiate Baseball – a mark that tied the record for highest ranked class in school history.

The accolades and honors poured in for the Red Raiders in 2014 with six players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Players Draft or signing a free agent contract with an MLB organization following the draft. A pair of players – both whom had not been drafted previously in their careers – were selected in the top-10 rounds with left-handed pitcher Chris Sadberry going in the sixth round (Miami Marlins) and catcher Hunter Redman taken in the eighth round (Los Angeles Dodgers).

For the first time in school history the Red Raiders had a pair of Freshman All-America selections in consecutive seasons – both under Tadlock as head coach – as left-handed pitcher Dylan Dusek and Stephen Smith received the honor in 2014. The previous year, Eric Gutierrez and Jarrod Poteete were selected as two of the top freshmen in the country.

The Red Raiders had six All-Big 12 selections in 2014, including three first-team picks – a first for Tech since 2004. The Red Raiders also had three All-Big 12 second team selections, one Big 12 All-Freshman Team (Stephen Smith) member, the Big 12 Newcomer of the Year (Kirsch), three Academic All-Big 12 honorees, two ABCA All-Midwest Regional selections and Tyler Neslony who was named a finalist for the Gregg Olson Breakout Player of the Year Award. Tech had three Big 12 Player of the Week picks and had three players named Big 12 Newcomer of the Week.

Tadlock returned to his alma mater for the 2012 season as the program's associate head coach and recruiting coordinator following six successful seasons as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Oklahoma.

Tadlock has coached 124 MLB Draft picks – including 19 players who have advanced to MLB. He has mentored at least one draft pick during the last 20 seasons and has coached three first-round picks, 11 players taken in the top five rounds and 26 selections in the top-10 rounds.

Tadlock graduated with his bachelor's degree in physical education from Texas Tech in May 1992. He also earned a master's degree in education in August 1994 from the University of Texas at Tyler. Tadlock and his wife, Kelly, have two children: Chloe and Benjamin. Tadlock is originally from Denton, Texas and was born December 21, 1968.

MOSELEY MAKING FIFTH CAREER SERIES-OPENING START

Moseley is no stranger to starting series openers with Friday marking his fifth career series opening start. As a freshman, Moseley started the series opener against Prairie View A&M (W, 6.0 IP, 1 ER, 1 SO, 3 BB), Oklahoma (ND, 1.0 IP, 2 ER, 0 SO, 1 BB) and Kansas (L, 5.0 IP, 6 ER, 7 SO, 5 BB).

LAST TIME OUT ...

Moseley pitched four innings in his season debut on Opening Day against San Francisco while striking out at least one batter in all four innings, including a pair of strikeouts in the first. He allowed three runs (2 ER) all in the third inning while exiting the game with a no decision after four frames with the Red Raiders leading the Dons, 7-3.

LOCAL PRODUCT

Moseley is one of three current Red Raiders from Lubbock (Stephen Smith, Michael Davis) and was Tech's Opening Day starter - becoming the sixth underclassman to start for Tech on Opening Day since 1987.

Moseley signed early in November 2013 as a RHP - exactly three months before his first season to actually pitch. Moseley, a catcher during most of his little league and prep career, pitched for the first time as a senior at Lubbock Cooper HS (All-State - 10-2, 1.78 ERA, 111 SO, 78.2 IP).

FRESHMAN SUCCESS

Moseley served several roles on the mound as a freshman contributing as the team's closer (tied TTU freshman record - 3 saves) and made 5 starts as a Friday starter and making a pair of starts in the NCAA Tournament. Made starts vs. No. 3 Miami (Fla.) in the NCAA Regional Tournament and against No. 4 Ole Miss in the College World Series in 2014.



DUSEK AT A GLANCE

Dusek makes his second start of the season on Saturday in game one of the doubleheader. It is also Dusek's 16th career start and 11th career home start. The Red Raiders are a remarkable 14-1 during Dusek's 15 career starts while the lefty went 8-0 as a freshman and has started his sophomore season with a 1-0 record after opening weekend.

LAST TIME OUT ...

Dusek earned the win during his first start of the season going six innings (most by a Red Raider starter on opening weekend) allowing just five hits and two runs (both earned) with five strikeouts during Tech's 13-5 victory over San Francisco. Dusek benefited from a seven-run bottom of the first inning by Tech but also faced four batters over the minimum while recording three perfect three-up, three-down innings. Dusek retired the leadoff batter in 5-of-6 frames.

IMPRESSIVE STREAK COMES TO AN END AT 26.1 INNINGS

Dusek had his consecutive scoreless innings pitched streak come to an end during his season debut against San Francisco as he allowed a run in the third inning with two outs giving him 26.1 consecutive scoreless innings pitched. It marked the longest scoreless innings streak by a Red Raider since Jonny Drozd put together a 28.0-inning streak from the 2013 season into the 2014 campaign.

BATTLING CANCER AT A YOUNG AGE

Dusek battled cancer (acute lymphocytic leukemia) at a young age while being diagnosed in October 1998 at the age of three and then was cleared of cancer at age six.

DUSEK: 1-OF-3

Dusek was 1-of-3 Red Raiders that posted a perfect 0.00 ERA during the 2014 NCAA Tournament. He pitched 13.0 scoreless innings during eight shutout innings at No. 3 Miami (Fla.) in the Coral Gables Regional and tallied five shutout innings in game two of the Lubbock Super Regional which allowed Tech to advance to Omaha.

BREAKING BIG 12 FRESHMAN RECORD

Dusek's impressive freshman season led him to several accomplishments, one of those was breaking the Big 12 freshman ERA record that was previously held by Chance Ruffin of Texas (1.96 ERA in 2008). Dusek allowed only 16 earned runs in 74.1 innings as a freshman with a 1.94 ERA - that also ranks him ninth in Tech single-season history.

FRESHMAN SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

Dusek had quite the freshman season becoming the first Tech left-handed pitcher to earn Freshman All-America, tying for the team lead in wins (Cameron Smith), becoming the first Tech freshman to lead the team in ERA since 1988 (Rodney Steph, 3.98), making seven scoreless starts, breaking the school record for wins by a freshman and going 8-0 in 14 starts.



DAMRON POSTS CAREER HIGH 5.0 INNINGS IN SEASON DEBUT

Damron made nine outings as a freshman and only one start - so far this season his role has changed significantly while starting the year in a starters role. In his first start he posted a career-high five innings pitched while going two innings past his previous career-high three innings pitched in relief against New Mexico State (3/9/14).

LAST TIME OUT ...

Damron went five innings during his first start of the season against San Francisco while exiting the game with the Red Raiders leading 6-3 after five innings. He helped his cause by retiring the leadoff batter in all five innings pitched while getting the first two batters out in 3-of-5 frames.

HIGHEST DRAFTED RED RAIDER TO ARRIVE TO CAMPUS SINCE '07

Damron passed on the Dodgers' 13th round offer in 2013 becoming Tech's highest drafted prep to arrive to campus since 2007 when RHP Chad Bettis turned down a 8th round offer from the Astros. Damron was the only draft pick in the top 15 rounds the Dodgers did not sign.

DEBUT SEASON

Damron made nine outings (8 relief) as a freshman while making four scoreless appearances and allowing one or fewer runs in 8-of-9 appearances. He went 2-0 earning wins against Stephen F. Austin and Prairie View A&M.

TECH/LUBBOCK COMMUNITY CELEBRATE FORMER PLAYER & COACH WITH SIXTH-ANNUAL EVENT

Former Red Raider student-athlete and assistant coach Brooks Wallace is honored by the Texas Tech baseball program with the sixth-annual Brooks Wallace Memorial Series this weekend. Wallace, who is one of four Red Raiders to have their jersey number (#22) retired, died at the age of 27 on March 24, 1985 after an on-going bout with leukemia. Wallace played at Tech from 1977-80 while earning All-SWC honors and All-District VI recognition. He was twice selected in the MLB Draft by the Texas Rangers (21st Round) in 1980 and also by the New York Mets following his junior season at Tech in 1979. Wallace served as a graduate assistant coach under Kal Segrist in 1983 and as an assistant coach under Gary Ashby in 1984-85. In addition, the former Red Raider's name is also attached to the College Baseball Foundation's Brooks Wallace Award, an honor given annually to the nation's top collegiate shortstop.



NORTHERN ILLINOIS ALL-TIME SERIES

Texas Tech and NIU are meeting for a non-conference series for the eighth time - seventh time in Lubbock - since 2004. The Red Raiders lead the Huskies 16-2 in the all-time series with a 14-2 record against NIU in Lubbock. The Red Raiders have won 10 straight over NIU since 2007. The Red Raiders have scored double-figure runs in 10-of-18 all-time meetings with the Huskies.

NEW BASEBALL, NEW RESULTS

The NCAA changed baseballs for the 2015 season - the new ball's performance is supposed to make the collegiate game more offensive, which if you have been paying attention during the last four seasons has changed to a pitching dominated game based on the revamped bat that went into play in 2011.
