- Texas Tech is one of the nation's most consistently successful football programs as the Red Raiders have enjoyed winning or .500-plus seasons in 20 of the last 22 years and earned postseason bowl bids in 13 of their last 15 campaigns. Tech has also made 36 all-time bowl bids, a number that ranks among the nation's best.
- The Red Raiders enter their matchup with Sam Houston State with a 26-1 overall record against non-conference opponents at Jones AT&T Stadium dating back to the 2003 season.
- This is the first time in school history where Texas Tech has opened a season against Sam Houston State. The two teams have only met one other time previously which resulted in an 80-21 rout for the Red Raiders on Sept. 17, 2005, at Jones AT&T Stadium. Texas Tech boasts an 18-1 all-time record against FCS opponents.

RED RAIDERS KICK OFF 2015 AGAINST SAM HOUSTON ST.

Texas Tech kicks off its 91st season of college football with its 1,000th all-time game on Saturday, Sept. 5 when the Red Raiders host Sam Houston State at 2:30 p.m. CT in Jones AT&T Stadium. Saturday's game will be televised nationally by FOX Sports Net as part of Texas Tech's third-tier agreement with the cable network. Mike Morgan (play-by-play), Gary Reasons (color analyst) and Steffi Sorensen (sidelines) will call the game live from Jones AT&T Stadium in Lubbock. Max Michalak will handle production.

Fans may tune into one of the 44 region-wide affiliates of the Texas Tech Radio Network. Brian Jensen returns to the broadcast booth as play-by-play announcer for his 16th consecutive season and is joined by veteran John Harris, who will be in his 33rd year of providing analysis. In his sixth season, Chris Level rounds out the crew as sideline reporter.

In Sam Houston State, Texas Tech plays its 1,000th all-time football game. The Red Raiders own a 544-423-32 all-time football record in 90 total seasons. The Red Raiders have accumulated 55 winning seasons and advanced to 36 bowl games.

Both Texas Tech and Sam Houston State open their 2015 season on Saturday. Last year, Texas Tech finished a disappointing 4-8 overall and 2-7 in the Big 12 Conference. The sub-.500 season marked Texas Tech's second sub-.500 season in the last 22 years.

Sam Houston State enters the 2015 season ranked No. 4 nationally by the FCS Coaches and No. 3 in the STATS FCS polls. For the third time in the last four seasons, the Bearkats advanced to the FCS NCAA Semifinals before losing 35-3 to eventual national champion North Dakota State. The Bearkats tied for the Southland Conference title with an 11-5 overall and 7-1 league record. Sam Houston State, which has won eight of its last nine games, returns 21 starters, including nine on offense and 54 lettermen, including preseason all-conference quarterback junior Jared Johnson and sophomore defensive end P.J. Hall, the reigning conference freshman of the year. With 98 total points and eight first place votes, Sam Houston State was picked by league coaches to repeat as league champions in 2015. Twelve Bearkat players earned preseason All-Southland Conference honors.

The Red Raiders have won 12 consecutive season openers and 14 consecutive home season openers dating back to the 1992 season. Tech has also defeated each of its last 14 FCS opponents since 1988.

Beginning his third season as Texas Tech's head football coach, Kliff Kingsbury returns 16 starters from last year's team. As head coach at his alma mater, Kingsbury is 2-0 in season openers, including a 42-35 home win over Central Arkansas in 2014 and a 41-23 win at SMU in 2013.

TEXAS TECH AND SAM HOUSTON STATE

- Texas Tech and Sam Houston State meet for the second time in series history. Tech is 1-0 all-time vs. SHSU.
- The two schools first met on Sept. 17, 2005, at Jones AT&T Stadium. The Red Raiders claimed an 80-21 victory before 50,171 in attendance.
- With its 80 points against SHSU, Texas Tech snapped its school scoring record, which stood for 52 years. The 1953 team set the previous mark with a 71-0 shutout of New Mexico A&M in Lubbock. The Red Raiders started quickly with four first quarter touchdowns and led 28-0. The four touchdowns set a school record for most TDs scored in a quarter. Tech's 49 points in the first half tied the school record for most points scored by halftime, matching the record set against Baylor in 2001.
- The Red Raiders amassed 770 total yards, a mark that ranks second in school history since 1950. Texas Tech quarterback Cody Hodges completed 26 of 37 passes for 436 yards and four TDs and backup Graham Harrell completed 14 of 17 passes for 208 yards with one TD. Robert Johnson led Tech with eight catches for 209 receiving yards.
- Against Southland Conference opponents, Texas Tech owns a 14-3 all-time record (Abilene Christian, 6-3; Central Arkansas, 1-0; Lamar, 2-0; Northwestern State, 2-0; Sam Houston State, 1-0; Stephen F. Austin, 2-0).

TEXAS TECH IN SEASON OPENERS

- Texas Tech holds a 61-26-3 all-time record in its 90 season openers. The Red Raiders defeated Central Arkansas 42-35 in last year's season opener.
- Since converting to the spread offense under Mike Leach in 2000, Texas Tech has averaged 40.7 points per game over the course of the 15 season openers. Below is a list of current national season opening win streaks:

TEXAS TECH IN HOME SEASON OPENERS

- Texas Tech owns a 68-18-3 all-time record in home season openers.
- Texas Tech has won each of its last 14 home season openers.
- The Red Raiders have also won each of its last 22 home-opening games.
- Then-No. 15 Oklahoma was the last team to defeat Texas Tech in a home opener as the Sooners registered a 34-9 win over the Red Raiders on Sept. 3, 1992. The game was played prior to the formation of the Big 12 Conference.
- Texas Tech is facing an FCS opponent in its home opener for the seventh time in the last 11 seasons.
- Since 2000, Texas Tech has averaged 40.7 points per game in season openers. The most points scored by Tech in a home season opener during that stretch was 70 points vs. TCU in 2004. The Red Raiders defeated the Horned Frogs 70-35 after overcoming an early 21-0 deficit with 56 unanswered points.

TOUGH EARLY SEASON SCHEDULE

According to the Associated Press preseason college football top-25 poll, Texas Tech will play three-consecutive nationally ranked opponents through its first five games: at No. 18 Arkansas (Sept. 19), vs. No. 2 TCU (Sept. 26) and vs. No. 4 Baylor (Oct. 3) at AT&T Stadium in Arlington. Texas Tech is the only school in the nation currently scheduled to face three-consecutive nationally ranked opponents through its first five games. Only two other teams in the nation will face three nationally ranked teams through their first five contests. Alabama plays No. 20 Wisconsin, No. 17 Ole Miss and No. 9 Georgia. Virginia plays at No. 13 UCLA, No. 11 Notre Dame and No. 23 Boise State. Overall, Texas Tech will face four AP preseason top-25 teams this year.

TEXAS TECH AGAINST THE FCS

Since 1978 when the NCAA divided its Division I schools into two divisions, Texas Tech has compiled an 18-1 all-time record against FCS opponents. All of those games were played at Jones AT&T Stadium. It has also won its last 14 consecutive games against FCS opponents since the 1988 season. In 2006, the NCAA renamed Division IA and Division I-AA to FBS to note the distinction in football programs.

FROM SUB-.500 SEASON TO SUCCESS

Since the 1985 season, the last five times Texas Tech went through a losing season, the Red Raiders responded the following season with a record of .500 or better. Furthermore, in four of those five seasons, the Red Raiders rebounded with a postseason bowl berth (2012-Meinecke Texas Bowl; 1993-John Hancock Bowl; 1989 All-American Bowl; 1986 Independence Bowl).

Here are the seasons:

- From 5-7 in 2011 to 8-5 in 2012
- From 5-6 in 1992 to 6-6 in 1993
- From 4-7 in 1990 to 6-5 in 1991
- From 5-6 in 1988 to 9-3 in 1989
- From 4-7 in 1985 to 7-5 in 1986

TEXAS TECH: A MODEL OF SUCCESSFUL CONSISTENCY

Since 1993, Texas Tech has endured just two sub-.500 seasons. On that note, Texas Tech ranks among the nation's top-six programs in regards to experiencing the least sub-.500 seasons since 1993. Only four NCAA FBS college football programs—Florida State (0), Southern California (1), Ohio State (1) and Florida (1)—have fewer sub-.500 seasons in the last 22 years:

BACK-TO-BACK LOSING SEASONS ARE RARE AT TEXAS TECH

Texas Tech enters the 2015 season coming off only its second sub-.500 season in 22 years (4-8 in 2014). A sub-.500 season is a rarity for the Texas Tech football program. Even more of a rarity is back-to-back sub-.500 seasons at Texas Tech. The last time Tech had back-to-back losing seasons was in 1984-85. The Red Raiders endured six consecutive losing seasons from 1979-85.

PRODUCTIVE EXPERIENCE RETURNS TO TEXAS TECH

With 16 starters and 48 total letterwinners returning to the Texas Tech football program in 2015, the Red Raiders have experience back in a variety of position groups and statistical areas. The following chart depicts how much production Texas Tech has returning in each statistical category:

BIG 12 CONFERENCE

GROUP OF 23 SENIORS PROVIDE LEADERSHIP FOR TECH
 Texas Tech has the benefit of a 23-member senior class. It is the largest senior class that Kliff Kingsbury has had since he became head coach three years ago. Ten of those seniors were listed as starters on the 2014 preseason depth chart. Senior leaders for Texas Tech include DeAndre Washington (RB), Le'Raven Clark (OL), Pete Robertson (RUSH), Branden Jackson (DE), Jared Kaster (C) and Jakeem Grant (WR).

OFFENSIVE LINE ANCHORS TECH OFFENSE
 A major strength for Texas Tech is its offensive line as the Red Raiders return four of their five starters, including senior All-America candidate Le'Raven Clark (38 career starts), senior center Jared Kaster (25 consecutive starts), senior Alfred Morales (19 career starts) and junior Baylen Brown (12 career starts). The unit is a major strength for the Texas Tech offense as it returns 73 percent of its starts from last year's team. The Red Raiders allowed just 13 sacks in 12 games in 2014, a figure that ranked No. 12 nationally. Three of the 13 sacks came in the fourth quarter against Oklahoma State. Prior to the fourth quarter in Stillwater, the Tech offensive line had not allowed a sack in 19 consecutive quarters dating back to the 2013 Holiday Bowl win over Arizona State.

WASHINGTON RUNS FOR 1,000 RUSHING YARDS
 Senior DeAndre Washington became the first running back at Texas Tech since 1998 to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season in 2014. He became the first player in the history of its spread offense to hit the 1,000 rushing yard mark. There have been only six Red Raiders who have rushed for 1,000 yards in a single season—four of those players accomplished the feat twice. The last Red Raider to rush for 1,000 yards was Ricky Williams, who tallied the third most rushing yards in school history with 1,582 in 1998.

ROBERTSON WRECKS HAVOC ON OPPOSING QUARTERBACKS
 All-Big 12 Second Team selection Pete Robertson enters the 2015 season as one of the premier pass rushers in the country as the senior led the Big 12 Conference in sacks and ranked fourth nationally with 12. His 12 sacks also rank fourth among single-season leaders in school history. Robertson also became the first Red Raider during the Big 12 era (since 1996) to register a sack in six consecutive games (Sept. 25-Nov. 1, 2014). He concluded the season with at least one sack in eight of his last nine games played.

Robertson enters the 2015 season ranked ninth among school career sacks leaders with 16.0. The school record is 34.0 held by Aaron Hunt from 1999-2002. Robertson led the Red Raiders defense in tackles (81), tackles for loss (14.5-74), sacks (12), quarterback hurries (7) and forced fumbles (3).

PRESEASON HONORS ROLL IN FOR LE'RAVEN CLARK
 Texas Tech offensive left tackle Le'Raven Clark enters the 2015 campaign as an All-America candidate. The two-time All-Big 12 First Team honoree has been named to watch lists for the Outland Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Trophy for the third-straight season. He was also selected to three preseason All-America teams including The Sporting News (Second Team), Athlon Sports (Third Team), Phil Steele (Fourth team).

MAHOMES MATURES LATE IN 2014 SEASON
 With four starts in seven games, sophomore quarterback Patrick Mahomes played like a seasoned veteran as a true freshman in 2014. In the season finale against Baylor on Nov. 29, 2014 at Arlington's AT&T Stadium, Mahomes made his fourth consecutive start. He threw for a career-high 598 yards, completed 30 of 56 passes with six touchdowns and an interception. For his effort against Baylor, Mahomes was named the Big 12's Offensive Player of the Week after setting the Big 12 Freshman and Texas Tech freshman record with 598 passing yards. He also became the first freshman in school history to throw six touchdown passes in a game. Mahomes closed out the year by throwing for over 300 yards in three consecutive games and completing four touchdown passes in three straight games. On the year, Mahomes threw for 1,547 yards and completed 105 of 164 passes with 16 touchdowns.

GRANT MOVES UP ON CAREER KICK RETURN YARDS LIST
 Senior wide receiver Jakeem Grant continues to climb the Texas Tech's career kickoff return yardage list and now sits in sole possession of fourth place.

 Texas Tech easily stakes claim to the tag "Wide Receiver U" and has the numbers to prove it. Since 2000, Texas Tech receivers have caught 583 touchdown passes and hauled in 71,897 receiving yards—both of which lead the nation. In addition, the Red Raiders have two Biletnikoff Awards on display in their trophy case and two of the most prolific receivers in the NFL: Michael Crabtree and Wes Welker.

MORE ON DAVIS WEBB

- Webb needs 1,121 more passing yards to move into eighth place on the Texas Tech career passing yards list. Webb has 5,257 career passing yards through 18 games.
- Webb has thrown at least one touchdown pass in the first 18 games of his career and that marks a school record for a Texas Tech quarterback.
- With two touchdown passes against TCU on Oct. 25, 2014, Webb moved into seventh place on the career touchdown passes list. He needs just five more touchdowns to move past Robert Hall into sixth place.
- Threw for 300 yards against TCU for his 10th career 300-plus yard passing game.
- Webb's 76-yard touchdown pass to Devin Lauderdale in the first quarter of the West Virginia game marked the longest touchdown pass by a Red Raider since 2009 when Taylor Potts connected with Trammie Swindall for a 79-yard touchdown at Jones AT&T Stadium during the Red Raiders' 48-28 win over New Mexico. Webb's 76-yard TD pass to Lauderdale is the longest touchdown pass/reception by a Red Raider quarterback and wide receiver in Big 12 play since 2006 when Graham Harrell threw a 76-yard touchdown pass to Joel Filani during Tech's 55-21 win over Baylor on Nov. 4 at Jones AT&T Stadium.
- Webb threw for 348 yards and three touchdowns against West Virginia on Oct. 11, 2014.
- Webb threw for 374 yards (35-54-2) and four touchdowns in the Big 12 opener at Oklahoma State, Sept. 25, 2014.
- Left the game in the fourth quarter at Oklahoma State after suffering a left shoulder injury. Prior to that, Webb had led the Red Raider offense for 337-consecutive snaps dating back to the first half of the Holiday Bowl in 2013. He returned the following week and threw for 301 yards and two touchdowns at Kansas State.
- Webb threw three touchdowns in Texas Tech's 30-26 win over UTEP at the Sun Bowl on Sept. 6, 2014. His 31 passing attempts (17-31) were the second fewest of his career as a starting quarterback. Engineered the second game-winning drive of his career against UTEP as held a 7-play, 75-yard drive late in the fourth quarter that resulted in a 9-yard touchdown pass to Bradley Marquez. The TD drive gave Texas Tech a 30-26 lead and ultimately the victory over the Miners.
- Against Central Arkansas, Webb overcame a sluggish start and threw for 452 yards (39-52 passing) and four touchdowns to lead the Red Raiders to a 42-35 win over the Bears. Webb's performance was the best by a Texas Tech quarterback in a season opener since Graham Harrell threw for 536 yards (43-58) against Eastern Washington in 2008.

BRIEFLY

- Texas Tech has scored in 219-consecutive games dating back to Oct. 25, 1997. That streak is currently the second longest active streak in the Big 12 Conference (Kansas State, 222).
- Texas Tech overcame its first halftime deficit of the Kliff Kingsbury era at Iowa State on Nov. 22, 2014. The Red Raiders overcame a 17-14 halftime deficit and went on to win, 34-31. Prior to the Iowa State game, Texas Tech was 0-10 the last two seasons when trailing at halftime.
- Texas Tech concluded the 2014 season ranked No. 10 nationally in total offense (504 yards per game) and No. 5 in passing offense (351 yards per game).
- Texas Tech has posted 325-plus yards of total offense in 40 straight games, the longest active streak in the FBS.
- Texas Tech had 11 different receivers catch a touchdown pass in 2014.
- Texas Tech has played four true freshmen quarterbacks in the last two years while three have gotten starting nods.
- Last year, Texas Tech ranked tied for 116th nationally in turnover margin (-1.08) and 114th in turnovers lost (28).
- Senior offensive tackle Le'Raven Clark leads the team with the most consecutive starts. He currently has a streak of 38 consecutive games started.
- On offense, Texas Tech returns nine starters, including its leading rusher (Washington), two leading passers (Webb and Mahomes), leading receiver (Grant) and four of its five offensive line starters (Clark, Kaster, Morales and Brown).

Tech currently holds the longest active bowl win streak in the Big 12 Conference and the longest in school history. Tech's streak of bowl wins started in San Antonio with a 41-31 win over Michigan State in the 2009 Alamo Bowl. The Red Raiders last registered a 37-27 victory over No. 16 Arizona State in the 2013 National University Holiday Bowl. Texas Tech's 36 all-time bowl appearances ranks tied for No. 17 nationally.

- David Gibbs begins his first year as Texas Tech's Defensive Coordinator.
- Texas Tech returns seven defensive starters from a youthful 2014 unit. Returning starters include Branden Jackson (DE), Pete Robertson (RUSH), J.J. Gaines (SS), Justis Nelson (CB), Keenon Ward (SS), Tevin Madison (CB) and Nigel Bethel II (CB).
- Last year, Texas Tech used a total of 26 newcomers on both sides of the ball, including nine true freshmen. Of that group, 17 were listed as defensive players.
- In 2014, Texas Tech used four true freshmen in its secondary as Nigel Bethel II, Derrick Dixon, Jah'Shawn Johnson and Tevin Madison all saw action during the season. Madison started the first five games at cornerback before Bethel earned the nod in each of the last seven contests. Dixon, meanwhile, made his first two career starts at Iowa State and vs. Baylor.
- Over half of the Red Raider defensive players (21 of 35) who have recorded at least one tackle in 2014 were classified as a freshman, sophomore or newcomer to the Tech roster.
- Among Red Raiders defensive players with a tackle in 2014, eight were freshmen, seven were sophomores, 14 were juniors and six were seniors.
- In 2014, Texas Tech boasted one of the youngest secondaries in the country as the Red Raiders used a pair of true freshmen at cornerback (Tevin Madison and Nigel Bethel II) in the starting lineup as well as a true sophomore in Justis Nelson at the other corner spot, a sophomore in Keenon Ward and a junior in J.J. Gaines at the two safety spots. Jalen Barnes and Derrick Dixon, both freshmen, both recorded a start at safety as well. All those players are a year older now.
- Texas Tech returns four of its top six leading tacklers from a year ago: Pete Robertson (47-34-81), Micah Awe (48-21-69), Keenon Ward (53-14-67) and J.J. Gaines (37-26-63), and its top two sack and tackles for loss leaders in Robertson (sacks: 12.0-67; TFL: 14.5-74) and Branden Jackson (sacks: 5.0-22; TFL: 10.5-31).

CONSECUTIVE GAME SCORING STREAK

Texas Tech is currently riding a consecutive game scoring streak that spans 219 games dating back to the 1997 season. The streak ranks 13th nationally and is the third-longest streak in the Big 12 Conference behind Kansas State:

ATTENDANCE RECORD FALLS FOR THIRD STRAIGHT YEAR

Texas Tech fans showed yet again why they are the most loyal fans in the country as an average attendance record was set in 2014 at Jones AT&T Stadium for the third consecutive season. Texas Tech needed just 53,004 in attendance at the final home game against Oklahoma on Nov. 15, but instead enjoyed a crowd of 59,014 in the home finale. The Oklahoma game attendance figure gave Texas Tech a final average of 58,934 which surpassed last year's mark of 57,932. Overall, Tech's attendance has increased in each of the last three seasons.

BEST STUDENT BODY IN THE BIG 12

Texas Tech's football student section was ranked No. 10 in the country in a recent poll by USA Today. Tech had the only student section recognized in the Big 12 Conference. College Football Index—a poll conducted by USA Today—is a cumulative data-based ranking of America's most engaged fan bases in 2014. In 2013, ESPN's Jake Trotter ranked the Red Raider students the best student section in the Big 12. Texas Tech students not only provide a tremendous home field advantage, but they have turned out in record-setting numbers. In 2013, Texas Tech set an average student attendance record of 11,249 and a Jones AT&T Stadium individual game record of 16,092 for the Red Raiders' 20-10 victory over No. 24 TCU. In an era where student attendance is in decline across the country, the opposite is occurring in Lubbock at Tech students not only set facility attendance records at football, but also in basketball and baseball.

Kingsbury joins South Carolina's Steve Spurrier and Michigan's Jim Harbaugh as the only three active coaches to accomplish this feat. Spurrier won the Heisman Trophy in 1966 and played 10 seasons in the NFL. Harbaugh finished third in the 1986 Heisman Trophy race and played 13 seasons in the NFL.

KINGSBURY IS YOUNGEST COACH IN POWER 5 CONFERENCES

At the age of 36, Kliff Kingsbury is the youngest head coach in the Power 5 and the third youngest coach in the FBS. He was named head coach at Texas Tech on Dec. 12, 2012.

HOCUTT SELECTED TO CFP COMMITTEE

Texas Tech Athletics Director Kirby Hocutt begins his first year of service on the prestigious 13-member College Football Playoff Committee. The College Football Playoff Committee matches the No. 1 seed vs. No. 4, and No. 2 vs. No. 3 in national semifinal games that rotate annually among the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Goodyear Cotton Bowl, Capital One Orange Bowl, Allstate Sugar Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Northwestern Mutual and Fiesta Bowl. The committee members produce weekly rankings after the ninth weekend of games. The members meet in person on Mondays and Tuesdays. The committee will issue its first rankings on Tuesday, Nov. 3 (6:30 p.m. CT) and will reveal its rankings on ESPN each week.

CAMPAIGN FOR FEARLESS CHAMPIONS

Texas Tech unveiled the first athletics specific capital campaign in university history in a news conference on August 29, 2014. The Campaign for Fearless Champions is a comprehensive athletics campaign that will significantly impact every student-athlete and all 17 sports.

• Kliff Kingsbury (@TTUKingsbury) begins his third season as head coach at Texas Tech. He was named the 15th head coach in program history on Dec. 12, 2012.

• In his second season as head coach, Kingsbury led a young and inexperienced squad to a 4-8 overall record. His potent offense began to develop the balance he had been seeking, as running back DeAndre Washington became the first Red Raider to rush for over 1,000 yards in a single season since Ricky Williams did so in 1998. The Red Raider offense finished the season ranked 10th (504.1 yards-per-game) nationally while the pass offense ranked fifth (351.1 yards-per-game).

• In his first season in 2013, Kingsbury led the Red Raiders to an 8-5 overall record and a stunning 37-23 win over No. 16 Arizona State in the National University Holiday Bowl. He became just the second coach in school history to win a bowl game in his first season as the Red Raiders dismantled the heavily favored Sun Devils in San Diego. His popularity also helped revitalize the Texas Tech fan base as the Red Raiders set a new school record for average home attendance.

• Kingsbury returned to his collegiate roots after a one-year stint as offensive coordinator at Texas A&M in 2012 where he played a major role in leading freshman quarterback Johnny Manziel to the Heisman Trophy. Under his guidance, the Aggie offense finished third nationally in total offense by averaging 552.33 yards per game. The Aggies ranked 14th nationally in passing offense and 13th nationally in rushing offense, making Texas A&M one of the most balanced attacks in college football. For the second consecutive year, Kingsbury was named the national offensive coordinator of the year.

• Kingsbury made the move to Texas A&M from the University of Houston where he played a key role in the Cougars' record-setting 13-win season in 2011. The Cougars finished 2011 with a 13-1 record and posted the program's highest final BCS finish in school history (No. 19).

• Kingsbury served as co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Cougars in 2011, and was named the 2011 Offensive Coordinator of the Year by FootballScoop.com. The Cougars led the nation in total offense, passing offense and scoring in 2011, while record-setting quarterback Case Keenum placed seventh in the Heisman Trophy voting and won the Sammy Baugh Award.

• After a five-year professional football career, Kingsbury entered the coaching ranks in the spring of 2008 when he joined Sumlin's staff as an offensive quality control assistant. He later earned his first full-time position as quarterbacks coach in 2010.

• Kingsbury was drafted by Bill Belichick and the New England Patriots after a record-setting career at Texas Tech. Kingsbury received multiple honors including Associated Press Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year as a quarterback for the Red Raiders. In addition, he set 39 school records, 16 Big 12 marks and 17 NCAA records during his career at Tech (1999-2002). As a senior he was awarded the Sammy Baugh Trophy, presented annually to the nation's best college quarterback.

• The first in a long line of record-setting Texas Tech quarterbacks under then-head coach Mike Leach, Kingsbury recorded more than 12,000 passing yards and total offense including over 1,000 pass completions making him only the third player in NCAA history to accomplish all three. Kingsbury also excelled in the classroom as he was one of 14 collegiate football players to receive a post-graduate scholarship from the National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame as he also garnered Academic All-America Player of the Year honors in 2002.

• A native of New Braunfels, Texas, Kingsbury graduated from Texas Tech in 2001 with a bachelor's degree in management.

OFFENSES UNDER KINGSBURY

Since earning his first coordinator position at Houston in 2010, Kliff Kingsbury has annually produced one of the nation's top offenses. A two-time National Offensive Coordinator of the Year honoree, Kingsbury as produced an offense that has ranked 11th or better nationally in each of the past five seasons. 


